



Employer Job (PRSI) Incentive Scheme

What is the Employer Job (PRSI) Incentive Scheme?

The Employer Job (PRSI) Incentive Scheme means that when you employ additional **eligible workers** in 2010, you will not have to pay employer's PRSI in respect of their employment for twelve months from the date you are approved for the scheme. Under this scheme, you will be limited to a maximum of 5% of your existing workforce or five employees, whichever is the greater.

How do I qualify?

To qualify, you must employ a person who is:

- In receipt of one of the following payments for a continuous period of at least six months:
 - Jobseeker's Benefit
 - Jobseeker's Allowance
 - One-Parent Family Payment
 - Disability Allowance
- or
- On the Work Placement Programme administered by FÁS for at least three months.

The job must:

- Be new and additional
- Be for at least 30 hours a week
- Last for at least six months.

When and how do I apply?

This scheme is open to any employer who creates a new and additional job in 2010 which meets the scheme criteria. If you created a job in 2010 before the scheme was launched in June 2010, you may benefit from an employer's PRSI exemption for this job for twelve months from the date you are approved for the scheme.

If you are eligible and wish to employ a new employee under this scheme, complete a PRSI 20 form and submit a current tax clearance certificate.

How long does the exemption last?

The exemption is granted for a maximum of twelve months from the date of approval. If the person's employment ceases within six months of getting the exemption, you may be liable to pay the employers PRSI contributions for the new employee.

Approvals

When your application is approved, an exemption certificate in respect of the new employee will be sent to you with further details on how the employee records are to be kept.

Note

You should operate standard employee and employer PRSI pending approval.

Right of review

If you do not agree with a decision on your application, you may request, in writing, a review by the officer in charge of the section. You should enclose any new evidence in support of a review.
